Every family member should carry this information on a card with six quarters taped to the back for pay phones. Notify your contacts so that in the event of an emergency they will be expecting your call.

Emergency SUPPLIES:

The American Red Cross recommends every family have an emergency supply kit assembled long before a wildfire or other emergency occurs. Use the checklist below to help assemble yours. For more information on emergency supplies, visit the American Red Cross Web site at www.redcross.org.

- o Five-day supply of water (one gallon per person per day).
- o Non-perishable food for all family members and pets (three-day supply).
- o First aid kit.
- o Flashlight, battery-powered radio, and extra batteries.
- o An extra set of car keys, credit cards, cash or traveler’s checks.
- o Sanitation supplies.
- o Extra eyeglasses or contact lenses.
- o Important family documents and contact numbers.
- o Map marked with evacuation routes.
- o Family photos and other irreplaceable items.
- o Prescriptions or special medications.
- o Easily carried valuables.
- o Personal computers (information on hard drives and disks).
- o Chargers for cell phones, laptops, etc.

Note: Keep a pair of old shoes and a flashlight handy in case of a sudden evacuation at night.
